### The Day the Dentist Came to Visit...







<u>Give them time!</u>: We're often in a rush & end up not giving our child enough time to complete tasks. Children will certainly do things slower than us, but **be patient** & allow them to follow their own pace. This is a <u>must</u> in order for them to improve their ability to do things independently!

<u>Allow them to make choices</u>: This will empower them & teach them to be more self-reliant. Of course there are certain things which they MUST do, like taking a shower. Nonetheless, even in this case you can still give them a choice! For example: "Would you like to take a shower now or in 5 minutes?"

<u>Forget Perfection!</u>: It is very unlikely that children will do things perfectly when they are learning. The food might be all over the place when they feed themselves, shoes might be put on the wrong feet, they might spill juice when pouring it, etc. Getting upset over these mistakes will only discourage children from trying. Instead, get into a habit of praising their efforts & guiding them on how to fix the problem or do better next time.

<u>Trust & Encourage:</u> Allowing your child to do things independently & encouraging them to try new things on their own shows them that we trust & believe in them. And isn't it great when we feel people trust us to do things?! Your child feels the same way! Your encouragement, trust and support will boost their self-confidence and enhance their self-esteem as you will be helping them believe even more in their ability to do things.

<u>Practice Makes Perfect!</u>: Last but not least, give your child PLENTY of opportunities to practice the new skills & activities which they are learning to do by themselves. Doing something only once is not enough! <u>Consistency</u> is certainly the key to becoming more independent and improving our overall ability to perform certain tasks.

The month of November has been full of exciting and fun events!

We started the month by celebrating Flag Day at the Nursery. The children made their individual UAE flags. All of them were dressed in the colours of the flag (Red, Green, White & Black). The children then created a human UAE flag outdoors and took part in the flag day parade too. The festival of Diwali was also celebrated at the Nursery, wherein the children looked lovely in their traditional and colourful clothes. They also prepared some beautiful Diwali crafts and took their decorated mud diyas home to share with their families.

Ashwin and Hamzah had their 3<sup>rd</sup> birthday celebrations in November with their families and friends in the classroom. Thank you to Ashwin and Hamzah, and their respective families for celebrating their special day with us.

We had our first Field Trip of the Academic Year this month too. The children visited a Pizzeria. It was an enjoyable experience for our 'little chefs in the making' to prepare their own pizzas and eat them as well. Additionally, they also enjoyed their bus ride to the pizzeria! Furthermore, towards the end of the month we celebrated UAE National Day at the nursery. The children were dressed in traditional clothes or the colours of the flag. They participated in a couple of activities, such as: henna application, dates and hummus tasting with carrots, cucumbers and khaboos.

Throughout the month we focused on the theme: "My Dubai". The children were made familiar with the concept of 'I live in Dubai'. The theme involved the introduction of new vocabulary words, important and famous monuments in Dubai, the National Bird, traditional clothing and much more. They were also exposed to some basic greeting words in the Arabic Language. Several theme-related activities were conducted, along with our letter-sounds and numbers introduction. In addition to the theme, the children were explained the importance of Oral Hygiene and how they can take care of their teeth. To reinforce this, a dental presentation was conducted by the dentist who also checked the children's teeth.


All in all, it has been a fun-packed month! All this would not have been possible without your constant support and cooperation. A big thank you to all parents from our TIN Team!

#### Below is a brief outline on how we have worked throughout the month towards developing all areas of learning:





## Personal Social and Emotional Development

- Enhancing the children's self-care skills and care towards the environment, especially during snack time (opening & closing snack box, cleaning up after eating and more).
- Encouraging children to be nice to their friends and being good helper toward the adults and peers.
- Importance of Oral Hygiene Nursery Presentation & Dentist Visit (activity: toothbrush painting).
- Introduction of the Festival Diwali.
- Introduction of UAE (United Arab Emirates) & My Dubai.

## Communication/Language and Literacy



- Learning vocabulary words related to the Festival of Diwali.
- Reinforcement of the letters and the sounds: "S s", "A a", "Tt", "I i" and "Pp" through the Jolly phonics story, song and action, introduction of the letter sound "Nn" & "Cc".
- Learning new vocabulary words related to the "My Dubai" theme & the names of popular monuments in the city. Also, introduction of Arabic Greeting words.
- Talking about the Traditional attire of the city that we live in, as well as the spoken language, currency, food and rulers.
- Songs & Stories related to the theme.
- Line tracing, free reading time, Mark Making, Name Identification.



#### Physical Development

- Gross: Exploring the Parachute with plastic balls. Action Song. Obstacle course. Musical Chair game. Practice different directions walking and attempt various balancing poses.
- Kiddie Gym sessions on Sundays.
- Fine: Free Mark-Making, sticking and coloring activities, paper tearing, cutting strips of paper, using hole punchers, paper crumbling, putting on and taking off shoes.
- Using tongs to transfer pompoms/bottle caps, transferring of sand using a funnel, transferring cotton balls into bottles/empty tissue rolls,



### Understanding of the World

- Talking about Diwali, how it is celebrated and the different aspects related to it.
- Celebration of Flag Day: Flag Day Parade.
- Introduction and focus on new theme: "My Dubai". Talking about the famous monuments placed in the city. Also, mentioning the National Animal.
- ❖ Talking about the Desert and the various characteristics of sand.
- Power Point Presentation of "United Arab Emirates" & "Dubai".
- Activity: Each class created a famous landmark of Dubai.



#### **Mathematics**

- Introduction of Number 5 identification (worksheet).
- Revision of shapes introduced (making different shapes using popsicle sticks).
   Introduction of the shape diamond.
- Reinforcement of numbers 1-5 using number rods.
- Introduction fo 7 Emirates concept.
- Introduction of position words: up, down, in front, behind.
- "Teddy Bear Game" to develop mathematical language.



#### Expressive Art and Design

- The letter and the sound "n" & "c" crafts (rainbow tracing and making a nest & cat).
- Winter Concert Singing and Dancing practice.
- Dance and Movement Sessions, exploring different instruments and
- Painting with small building blocks, Mixing colours (free painting).
- Flag Day Craft.
- Diwali related crafts: Decorating a diya and making a lantern/diya craft.
- Desert Sand collage.
